



Child Abuse & Neglect In Our Community

- Over **35,000** reports of child abuse and neglect each year
- 6,780 children in the state's care
- **580+** children in Johnson County in foster care or needing foster parents.
- 200+ beds needed!




Statistics for Black Foster Children

- 2x more likely to enter foster care than white children
- 15% of the population, but more than 30% of the foster children population in the U.S.
- Remain in foster care for longer periods, less likely to get adopted, and experience lower family reunification rates than white children
- 25% prison population are black foster children



How the Foster Care System Works

- The state investigates a claim of abuse then tries to keep family together through preservation services.
- At last resort, if the home isn't safe, the youth will be placed in temporary foster care
 - Relatives or non-related kin whenever possible
 - Keep children in their community whenever possible
 - A safe place that gives the child and birth family an opportunity to resolve conflicts/disruptions and learn healthy skills
 - More than half of children return home safely
 - Goal is to reintegrate within 1 year



How the Foster Care System Works

If it is no longer safe for a child to return home, adoption is sought

Most children are adopted by relatives or foster parents

Some children have no relatives or foster parents that are able/willing to adopt them. We work to locate an adoptive family for them through our website and advocating in the community.

#1 – Become a Foster Parent


- First step is the FREE 30-hour (virtual) training class!

 - 21+ years old
 - Basic income guidelines
 - Provide adequate bedroom space
 - Reliable transportation
 - Standard background check
- Keep children in their school / district / community
- Staying connected is critical for kids
- You'll be filled with a sense of purpose!

- If you're considering becoming a foster parent, KVC Kansas is here to guide you every step of the way. We will provide you with:
