We believe all public-school administrators in the district have the responsibility to maintain a nurturing environment that fosters student academic growth and development while simultaneously safeguarding their well-being. Hopefully, parents, guardians, and students understand the school's policy that clearly defines what constitutes harassment, racism, hate speech, and bullying with an outline of the consequences for such behavior.

Additionally, it is crucial to establish reporting mechanisms that allow students to report negative incidents, confidentially and confidently that are experienced or witnessed. In reporting incidents they should expect corrective action to be taken that will prevent and eliminate future problems.

Equipping and educating students with the knowledge and skills to address and prevent such behaviors should be a top priority in Shawnee Mission East High School.
